

Coming up in Kumi Now


Each week below will have an online gathering with a guest or guests speaking on the topic. The time and Zoom link will be the same each week.




March 16: Week 11 - Olive Trees

This week we will look at how Palestinians in the occupied territory face rampant destruction of their olive trees and livelihoods. As more trees are uprooted and burned by settlers and Israeli occupation forces, brave farmers work to replant and undo the damage. However, their resources are stretched thin and livelihoods and traditions are at stake.

For our Kumi Action we will continue our support of Palestinian olive tree planting initiatives and spread information about the recent widespread destruction of olive trees.



March 23: Week 12 - Natural Resources

This week, as the United Nations and the world observe World Water Day on March 22, we will focus on environmental exploitation. The West Bank is rich in natural resources. However, due to Israel's occupation and control over the occupied Palestinian territory, access to and use of Palestinians' natural resources is obstructed. Rampant throughout the occupied territory, this practice is at its worst around the Dead Sea, where Israel exploits the land for its water and minerals.

For the Kumi Action we will spread information about AHAVA's illegal exploitation of Dead Sea resources.

March 30: Week 13 - Conditions in Gaza

On March 30 Palestinians celebrate Land Day, a commemoration of the first Palestinian general strike, in 1976, against land confiscation in Israel. On the same date in 2018, Palestinians in the Gaza Strip launched the Great March of Return to protest the blockade of Gaza and demand the right to return to their lands. This

Just the facts...

10% of women are delayed at checkpoints while travelling to hospital to give birth.

Women are delayed for hours (often without food/water), endure verbal or physical abuse, stripped semi-naked, slapped, and worse.

Checkpoints make it difficult or impossible to transport tools/materials, slowing repairs and the building of infrastructure.

The permit regime, wall, and checkpoints isolate East Jerusalem from the rest of the West Bank.

From 2000 and 2005, 67 women were forced to give birth at Israeli military checkpoints. 36 babies died.

Under international law, Israel has the obligation to facilitate the free movement of Palestinians within the oPt.

Over 400 kilometres of roads are prohibited or restricted for Palestinian vehicles.

Most farmers require special permits to reach their land isolated between the wall and the Green Line.

About 88,000 Palestinians are forced to use detours, two to five times longer, to reach the closest city.

Kumi Week #9: Restrictions on Movement

Week 9 of Kumi Now is now available [on the website](#). The checkpoints throughout the occupied Palestinian territory control and choke the lives of Palestinians. In 2014, UNAIDS declared March 1 as Zero Discrimination Day. Michel Sidibé, Executive Director of UNAIDS, stated in 2019 that, “Laws must protect, not cause harm. All countries must carefully examine their laws and policies in order to ensure equality and protection for all people, without exception.” For Palestinians faced with the daily humiliations and delays caused by the checkpoints, we must shed light on the restrictions of movement for Palestinians within Palestine. Here’s what you need to know and what you can do so that together we can *rise up*.

Understanding Settlements and Violence: Just the Facts...

- In 2016, Israeli forces deployed an average of 107 adhoc ‘flying’ checkpoints along West Bank roads each week.
- Between 2000 and 2005, 67 Palestinian mothers were forced to give birth at Israeli military checkpoints. 36 babies died.
- A total of 5,587 flying (temporary) checkpoints were counted on West Bank roads in 2016.
- There are 124 gates at the entrances to villages – 59 of them closed most of the time.
- About 88,000 Palestinians are forced to use detours, two to five times longer, to reach the closest city.
- Most Palestinian farmers must obtain special permits or ‘prior coordination’ to reach their land isolated between the wall and the Green Line.
- Over 400 kilometres of roads are prohibited or highly restricted for Palestinian- plated vehicles.
- Under international law, Israel has the obligation to facilitate the free movement of Palestinians within the oPt, including East Jerusalem.
- The permit regime, wall, and checkpoints have progressively isolated East Jerusalem from the rest of the West Bank.
- 10 percent of pregnant women are delayed at checkpoints while travelling to hospital to give birth.
- In Hebron, Palestinian children living and/or studying in schools in the Old City must walk through up to four Israeli military checkpoints just to reach school.
- Palestinian women passing through the checkpoint system are subjected physical hardship and the constant risk of harassment.
- Palestinian women are delayed for hours (often without food/water), endure verbal or physical abuse, stripped semi-naked, slapped, and worse.
- Checkpoints make it difficult or impossible to transport tools and work materials throughout different areas of occupied al-Khalil, slowing or preventing repairs and the building of infrastructure.

Kumi Action



Every time you go through a door or cross the street, wait for a minute to try to better understand what it is like to not have the freedom of movement like many Palestinians. If walking with someone, share the ‘why’ behind your waiting: checkpoints prevent many Palestinians from freely moving around. Write about the importance of freedom of movement on social media alongside a picture of one of the military checkpoints. - An Israeli plan to send COVID-19 vaccines to Syria, Honduras, the Czech Republic, and Guatemala, but not Palestine, was at least temporarily held up by Israeli courts. ([Mondoweiss](#))
- Prime Minister Mohammad Shtayyeh announced a new set of restrictions in response to a recent surge in coronavirus infections. ([WAFA](#))
- Speaking of discriminatory restrictions on movement, Israeli occupation forces on Friday placed military barricades at the entrances of the Old City, obstructing Palestinian worshippers from reaching Al-Aqsa Mosque. ([Palestine Chronicle](#))

- On Friday, Palestinians in Hebron marked the 27th anniversary of the horrific Ibrahimi Mosque massacre. But they were prevented by Israeli authorities from performing the calls-to-prayer on the pretext that Jewish settlers, who took over half of the mosque and turned it into a synagogue following the 1994 massacre, were celebrating the holiday of Purim. - **Palestine Solidarity Campaign** writes that "Facebook is currently deciding whether to change its hate speech policy in a way that will fundamentally undermine your ability to talk about Israel on its platform. The social media giant is considering restricting the use of the word "Zionist" by equating it to the words "Jew" or "Israeli," making it a protected category. This means Palestinians talking about their experiences of living under apartheid could have their posts blocked, and labelled as hate speech. 
