

On March 30 Palestinians celebrate Land Day, a commemoration of the first Palestinian general strike, in 1976, against land confiscation in Israel. On the same date in 2018, Palestinians in the Gaza Strip launched the Great March of Return to protest the blockade of Gaza and demand the right to return to their lands. This week, the Kumi Now community stands in solidarity with the citizens of Gaza as we focus on the blockade.

### April 6: Week 14 - Child Fatalities

Palestinians celebrate Children's Day on April 5. However, it is a bittersweet reminder that Palestinian children are a target of the occupation and, in the words of Al-Haq, part of the psychological warfare "utilized by Israel to constantly remind the Palestinian population that it is subjugated and occupied."

For our Kumi Action we will respectfully share the stories of children who have been hurt by the occupation.



### April 13: Week 15 - Home Demolitions

The use of violence, demolitions, and psychological warfare to force and scare Palestinians into leaving their homes and villages go back to the roots of the conflict. In 1948, operations such as the Deir Yassin massacre, which occurred April 9, destroyed whole villages and forced others to flee. While Israel's current home demolitions avoid much of the physical violence of those early operations, they still maintain the psychological elements, attempting to physically force them from their homelands and disincentivizing them from staying in their villages.

For our Kumi Action we will research if our own

governments, local and national, do business with the companies that supply the equipment for Israel's home demolitions and urge them to cut ties with these companies.



## April 20: Week 16 - Administrative Detention

This Palestinian Prisoners Day, April 17, let us remember the thousands of Palestinian political prisoners. At the end of 2019, 464 of these prisoners were being held through administrative detention. Through administrative detention, Palestinian detainees can be held indefinitely, with few legal rights.

For our Kumi Action we perform a thought experience on administrative detention, write about it, and share our experiences with others.



## April 27: Week 17 - Nation-State Law

On May 1, 2018, the Knesset passed the Nation-State law (officially Basic Law: Israel as the Nation-State of the Jewish People) in its first reading. As we approach the anniversary of this passage, we as a Kumi Community want to analyze this law and what it means for Palestinians and other minorities in Israel.

For our Kumi Action we will make it clear that it is not too late for Israeli politicians to change their direction and pass legislation that would provide equality for all of its citizens.

Only 30% of children ages 3-6 are able to attend licensed kindergartens.

The average number of students per class now exceeds 41.

In 2020, residents were receiving approximately 6 hours of electricity, followed by 8 hours off.

#### **Kumi Week #13: Conditions in Gaza**

Week 13 of Kumi Now is now available [on the website](#). Gaza's woes began in 1948 when, at the end of the 1948 War, it came under the control of Egypt. An influx of refugees fleeing the Palestinian villages and towns occupied and destroyed by Zionist forces quickly strained the Gaza infrastructure. Its status as the biggest prison on Earth was cemented by the Israeli occupation of Gaza in 1967. In 1994 administration of Gaza passed to the Palestinian National Authority, and in 2005 Israel withdrew its troops and settlers from Gaza.

However, following Hamas's takeover of the government in 2007, Israel and Egypt enforced the blockade of Gaza, and the years since then have seen bouts of violence and retaliation from both sides. Israel would argue that their incursions into Gaza were retaliation for missiles fired from Gaza. The reality, however, is that while both sides have suffered, the casualties inflicted upon Gazans by Israeli forces have been severely disproportionate and often indiscriminately target civilian areas. Here's what you need to

know and what you can do so that together we can *rise up*.

- Over 200 scholars have signed the [Jerusalem Declaration On Antisemitism](#), arguing that opposing Zionism and boycotting Israel are not antisemitic. The declaration is an alternative to the controversial [IHRA definition](#) of antisemitism that defines criticism and boycott of Israel as a form of antisemitism. 


### ***Determined to Stay: Palestinian Youth Fight for their Village***

Silwan is a Palestinian village located just outside the ancient walls of the Old City of Jerusalem. *Determined to Stay* is a moving story of a village and its people. As Silwani youth and community members share their lives with us, their village becomes an easily accessible way to understand Palestinian history and current reality. Written with young people in mind, the richly illustrated text stresses connections between the lives of youth in the US and Palestine: criminalization of youth, forced relocation, the impact of colonialism on Indigenous communities, efforts to bury history, and inspiring examples of resistance and resilience."

## **Palestine Blues**

The **Palestine Film Institute's** film of the week is **Palestine Blues** (Documentary, 72 minutes). You have until Wednesday to watch it for free [on their website](#). About the film:

“What is left for Palestinian farmers who learn that in 24hrs the Israeli Army will confiscate their lands for the construction of the wall? What do people do when their very survival is threatened by one of the world's most powerful armies? Palestine Blues tells the story of a village's confusion, desperation, and resistance, their daily victories and wrenching defeats. Unexpectedly filled with moments of poetry and humour this film's intimate access, unforgettable characters and story structure blur the line between documentary and narrative. Filmed at times with a hidden camera and at times under extreme duress, PalestinianAmerican filmmaker Nida Sinnokrot gives us a lasting chronicle of a people and their ancient lifegiving orchards, ever threatened by destruction.”
