Worldwide, the proportion of peace agreements with gender equality provisions increased from 14 to 22% between 1995 and 2019.

From 1992 to 2019, women averaged 13% of negotiators, 6 percent of mediators, and 6 percent of signatories in major peace processes.

7 out of every 10 peace processes did not include women mediators or women signatories.

Women's participation increases by 35 percent the probability of a peace agreement lasting 15 years.

Peace agreements are 64 percent less likely to fail when civil society representatives participate.

In Israel and Palestine, only a handful of women have served as official negotiators and technical advisors in the last thirty years, and even fewer have had leading roles in negotiations.

When women have participated in formal Israel/Palestine negotiations, they have been lauded as being critical to resolving impasses between parties.

Understanding Women in Peacebuilding: Just the Facts...

- Worldwide, the proportion of peace agreements with gender equality provisions increased from 14 to 22 per cent between 1995 and 2019.
- From 1992 to 2019, women averaged 13 percent of negotiators, 6 percent of mediators, and 6 percent of signatories in major peace processes.
- 7 out of every 10 peace processes did not include women mediators or women signatories.
- Women's participation increases by 35 percent the probability of a peace agreement lasting 15 years.
- Peace agreements are 64 percent less likely to fail when civil society representatives participate.
- As 40 peace processes since the end of the Cold War show, when women were able to exercise a strong influence on the negotiation process, there was a much higher chance that an agreement would be reached.
- In cases of strong influence of women an agreement was almost always reached.
- In Israel and Palestine, only a handful of women have served as official negotiators and technical advisors in the last thirty years, and even fewer have had leading roles in negotiations.

- When women have participated in formal negotiations, they have been lauded as being critical to resolving impasses between parties.

As a leading defender of women's rights in Palestine, WCLAC is proud of its uncompromising commitment to provide social and legal counselling and emergency shelter in an environment where human rights abuses are rampant and women's issues are regularly overlooked. Furthermore, it proposes bills and law amendments, works on policy developments, and monitors and documents violations of human rights as a consequence of the conflict.


March 12 to 18: Week 11 - Olive Trees

This week we will look at how Palestinians in the occupied territory face rampant destruction of their olive trees and livelihoods. As more trees are uprooted and burned by settlers and Israeli occupation forces, brave farmers work to replant and undo the damage. However, their resources are stretched thin and livelihoods and traditions are at stake.

For our Kumi Action we will continue our support of Palestinian olive tree planting initiatives and spread information about the recent widespread destruction of olive trees.

March 19 to 25: Week 12 - Natural Resources

This week, as the United Nations and the world observe World Water Day on March 22, we will focus on environmental exploitation. The West Bank is rich in natural resources. However, due to Israel's occupation and control over the occupied Palestinian territory, access to and use of Palestinians' natural resources is obstructed. Rampant throughout the occupied territory, this practice is at its worst around the Dead Sea, where Israel exploits the land for its water and minerals.

For the Kumi Action we will spread information about AHAVA's illegal exploitation of Dead Sea resources.



March 26 to April 1: Week 13 - Conditions in Gaza

On March 30 Palestinians celebrate Land Day, a commemoration of the first Palestinian general strike, in 1976, against land confiscation in Israel. On the same date in 2018, Palestinians in the Gaza Strip launched the Great March of Return to protest the blockade of Gaza and demand the right to return to their lands. This week, the Kumi Now community stands in solidarity with the citizens of Gaza as we focus on the blockade.

For our Kumi Action we will "check in" to Gaza on social media and share videos and other resources on Gaza with others.
